

BY-LAW 217-R-7-87
TOWN OF COALDALE
PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

A BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF COALDALE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE TRAFFIC ON FAIRWAY DRIVE.

WHEREAS Section 18 (2) (b) of the Off-Highway Vehicle Act, Chapter 0-4, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980, and amendments thereto, provides that the Council of a Municipality may by By-Law authorize persons to operate off-highway vehicles on any portion of highway under its direction and may restrict the hours during which operation may take place;

AND WHEREAS Section 18 (3) of the Off-Highway Vehicle Act, Chapter 0-4, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980, provides that a By-Law made pursuant to Section 18 (2) (b) may prescribe maximum and minimum rates of speed for off-highway vehicles;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Coaldale, duly assembled, hereby enacts, pursuant to the provisions of the Off-Highway Vehicle Act, Chapter 0-4, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980, and amendments thereto, that:

1. In this By-Law, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - a) "boulevard" means that part of a highway that
 - i) is not roadway, and
 - ii) is that part of the sidewalk that is not especially adapted to the use of or ordinarily used by pedestrians;
 - b) "daytime" means the period commencing one hour before sunrise and ending one hour after the following sunset;
 - c) "golf cart" means an off-highway vehicle primarily designed for the transportation of golfers and their equipment over a golf course;
 - d) "highway" means any thoroughfare, street, road, trail, avenue, parkway, driveway, viaduct, lane, alley, square, bridge, causeway, trestleway or other place, whether publicly or privately owned, any part of which the public is ordinarily entitled or permitted to use for the passage or parking of vehicles, and
 - i) includes
 - A) a sidewalk (including the boulevard portion of the sidewalk,

B) if a ditch lies adjacent to and parallel with the roadway, the ditch, and,

C) if a highway right-of-way is contained between fences or between a fence and one side of the roadway, all of the land between the fence and the edge of the roadway as the case may be;

e) "Off-highway vehicle" means any motorized vehicle designated for cross-country travel on land, water, snow, ice, marsh or swamp land or on other natural terrain and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes, when designated for such travel,

- i) 4-wheel drive or low pressure tire vehicles,
- ii) motor cycles and related 2-wheel vehicles,
- iii) amphibious machines,
- iv) all terrain vehicles,
- v) miniature motor vehicles,
- vi) snow vehicles
- vii) minibikes, and
- viii) any other means of transportation which is propelled by any power other than muscular power or wind,

but does not include

- ix) motor boats, or
- x) any other vehicle exempted from all of the provisions of the Off-highway Vehicle Act, Chapter 0-4, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980, and amendments thereto, by the regulations made under such Act;

f) "roadway" means that part of a highway intended for use by vehicular traffic;

g) "sidewalk" means that part of a highway especially adapted for the use of or ordinarily used by pedestrians, and includes that part of a highway between the curb line (or the edge of the roadway, where there is no curb line) and the adjacent property line, whether or not paved or improved:

2. A golf cart may be operated on the roadway portion of Fairway Drive, Town of Coaldale, during the daytime.

3. No person shall drive a golf cart on Fairway Drive within the Town of Coaldale at a greater rate of speed than 15 kilometers per hour.


This By-Law shall come into effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
