



## **Gateways and Corridors workshop outcomes**

**Date of workshop: December 7, 2018**

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### *Feedback provided by attendees during kick-off workshop*

- Signage to easy location of main street (business area at 13<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup> St)
- Landscape the green space with a vegetative buffer (area along HWY 3 west of Dairy Queen)
- Landscape green space. Add some berms, trees, groupings, and some boulders and mulch
- Larger signs; possibly digital
- Like trees, draws eyes to Coaldale sign
- Changeable copy signage may be okay if done properly
- Digital signage can be distracting to drivers
- Remove old buildings i.e. old fertilizer mill
- Old fertilizer plant – what's happening?
- Narrow boulevard in the center of main street with light standards decorated
- Let owners know what is expected re: buildings/lands/fences; Incentive to fix up areas; Let citizens know what is available to help them clean-up

- Repair owl sign or get new; Business directory; Barrier of trees McCain park; Sound safety wall HWY 3 (houses)
- Consistent 'Coaldale' signage
- Have old buildings etc removed; Welcome to Coaldale signage; Fix up old WTP paint...; Map/directory
- Have owners fix up store fronts; Repair sidewalks; Do stuff easy maintenance; Have staff enough to maintain
- Bioswales/storm water facilities
- Work with natural/native vegetation to enhance corridors and not have to rely on water to grow plants/trees
- Work with county on design standards in intermunicipal plan
- Pathways along east boundary along Cottonwood. Landscape the ditch along HWY 845
- West and East acceleration lanes at HWY 3 and 30 Street
- Fence
- Landscape area North of HWY before intersection coming from East; Some berms, trees and dry land seed!
