Be warm & safe this winter season

- Keep anything that can burn at least one metre away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove or portable space heater.
- Have a one metre "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
 - Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container.
 - Test smoke alarms at least once a month
 - \bullet Have a working Carbon Monoxide alarm in the house
