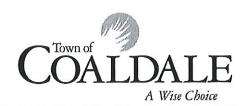

 - 5.1 Subdivision Application 2018-0-050

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

The purpose of the application is to subdivide a 0.38 ha (0.94 ac) parcel from a 7.53 ha (18.61 ac) parcel for residential use. The parcel subject of the application is legally described as Lot 3, Block 1, Plan 151 2220 within the NW1/4 14-9-20-W4M.

The proposed 0.94-acre parcel (Lot 5) contains a dwelling and yard site with mature trees. Servicing to the dwelling is provided municipally. Access is provided by an existing approach onto 14th Avenue, which is undeveloped save for a 50 m driveway that serves the parcel being subdivided and the parcel immediately to the south.

The proposed 17.67-acre remnant parcel (Lot 4) is vacant and currently cultivated with the exception of a small area in the northwest corner. Legal access to the parcel is available from both 13th Street and 14th Avenue. 13th Street (to the west) is fully developed, as is a 100 m stretch of 14th Avenue adjacent to the Town of Coaldale Public Works Shop.

The subject parcel was annexed into the Town of Coaldale by Order in Council No. 029/2018 effective April 1, 2018. In accordance with Section 135(d) of the Municipal Government Act, Lethbridge County's Land Use Bylaw is applicable to the subject parcel. The Rural Urban Fringe District typically requires a minimum 2.0-acre parcel size but allows for smaller parcels where they are connected to municipal services. When the remnant parcel is needed for urban development, It is likely that they will be used for industrial purposes in accordance with the direction provided in Map 23 of the Town of Coaldale Growth Study (2015) and Map 5 of the mutually adopted Intermunicipal Development Plan (2010).

R. Dyck noted the 10 % Municipal Reserve (MR) requirement is applicable. A deferred reserve caveat exists on the certificate of title for the parcel in the amount of 1.86 acres. It is recommended that MR be provide as a cash-in-lieu of land on the 0.94 acres. A land value of \$22,000 per acre was used in 2015. 0.94 acres at 10 % would equal \$2,068. It is recommended the remaining MR owing continue to be deferred against the remainder of the parcel pursuant to Section 669 of the Act.

- It was also noted ATCO Gas is looking for a right-of-way should it need to service Lot 5 in the future. It was suggested a utility right-of-way be included in the motion.
- There was a question on what the owner was planning to do with the land.
- It is all zoned urban fringe under the County's Land Use Bylaw. Following annexation, it remains under the County's LUB until the Town's LUB is updated to include this land.
- The Town's future plans indicate this area is considered for industrial lands.
- There was a question on how this will affect the current homes, will the be allowed to remain.
- Yes, the current homes will remain and it is unlikely any future residential development will take place. It was noted 14 Avenue is noted developed at this time.

MOTION: J. Abrey moved to approve Subdivision Application 2018-0-050 with conditions. That, pursuant to Section 654(1)(d) of the Municipal Government Act, all outstanding property taxes shall be paid to the Town of Coaldale. That, pursuant to Section 655(1)(b) of the Municipal Government Act, the applicant or owner or both enter into a Development Agreement with the Town of Coaldale which shall be registered concurrently with the final plan against the title(s) being created. That, a Utility Right-of-Way be established.

5.2 Development Application 2018-037
Lot coverage & side setback waiver- Existing Accessory Structure
1708-21 Street

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

The Town of Coaldale has received a development permit application for an existing accessory structure at the above-mentioned address. The applicant is requesting 2 waivers:

1. All accessory structures located at the above-mentioned property exceed the allowable 10% lot coverage. The coverage by the existing accessory structures is 14.6%.

- 2. The side yard setback of the accessory structures located along the north property line is 0.6 m whereas 0.9 m is the minimum allowable.
- There was a question on whether the applicant would consider reducing the fabric covered shelter in order to meet the area requirement.
- There was a question on whether the applicant is selling the house.
- There was a concern with the safety issue, due to the closeness of the buildings.
- It was noted the structures could be removed to adhere to the requirements for accessory structures.
- It was noted it was built without a permit and if the waiver is not approved it would have to be brought into compliance.

MOTION: R. Pitsol moved to refuse Development Application 2018-037 based on keeping with the Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13 requirement of 10% lot coverage for accessory structures and the safety concern with the structure being located so close to the property line.

5.3 Development Application 2018-038
Side yard setback waiver
1601-21 Street

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

The Town of Coaldale has received a development permit application to locate an air conditioner 0.6 m away from the side property line whereas 1.0 m is required.

- It was noted there were no letters from neighbours on this application.
- There were questions on the 1 metre requirement and the fact that on a number of properties the air conditioner would not fit if it had to be that distance from the property line.
- At one time the distance was required due to the noise made by air conditioners but newer models made less noise and may require less of setback.

MOTION: R. Pitsol moved to approve the side yard waiver for Development Application 2018-038 subject to the following conditions: 1. Must obtain approval of a Building Permit from Superior Safety Codes prior to commencement. 2. Setbacks to conform to site plan that was attached as part of the Development Permit application and to the current Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13, Schedule 2, Residential - R-1A.

5.4 Development Application 2018-043 Front yard setback waiver 456 Westgate Crescent

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

The Town of Coaldale has received a development permit application as the existing Single-Detached Dwelling is located 6.28 m away from the front property line whereas 7.62 m is required.

- There were several questions on how the Town is following up with building inspections to ensure homes are being built in accordance with the approved development applications.
- One of the newer requirements is for a take out by a certified Alberta Land Surveyor do ensure the builds meet the required setbacks.
- There was a question on the already allowed setback and it was noted this property was already at the 10% allowed due to the fact it was a corner lot.
- It was noted the original owner still owns the property.
- It was noted by granting the waiver the developer will always be encroaching on the setback.
- There is a need for the MPC to take a stand and let developers know they must adhere to their approved development applications and not be seeking waivers once they have built outside the allowed setbacks.
- It was noted this is the first such waiver request from this specific developer.
- A compliance letter should be required.

MOTION: R. Pitsol moved to table Development Application 2018-043 in order to allow the Municipal Planning Commission to ask the applicant questions and confirm stake out by a qualified Alberta Land Surveyor.

5.5 Development Application 2018-044
Change of Use – Discretionary Use
1328- 20 Street

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

We are in receipt of Development Application 2018-044 to establish Automotive Sales and Service at the above referenced property.

The Town of Coaldale Land-Use Bylaw states that Automotive Sales and Service is a Discretionary Use in the Industry - I zoning. As such, a hearing must be held by the Municipal Planning Commission (MPC) of the Town of Coaldale for consideration of the application.

Also, a compliance letter on the above-mentioned property was requested and showed that there are not permits for the existing accessory structures on the property. The compliance letter was issued on March 6, 2018 with the condition to apply for the outstanding permits within 60 days from the date on the letter. To, date, the owner has not contacted the town regarding this issue nor have they applied for the appropriate permits.

- This application is for change of use and is located on the two lots south of the museum.
- No letters were received from neighbours on this application.
- There were safety issues raised with the property.

- There was a question on whether there had been an inspection of the property to ensure it is in compliance as an existing operation.
- It was noted there are several outstanding issues on this property.
- There was also a concern over the amount of activity going on at this site.
- It is not the owner of the property that is applying for the application.
- There is now a shipping container bylaw in place and this property needs to comply with that bylaw.
- The MPC needs a written description and a proper site plan to consider the application.
- There is an issue of unsightly premises at this site.
- There are a number of issues that need to be addressed at this site before anything is approved.

MOTION: J. Abrey moved to table Development Application 2018-044 as the Municipal Planning Commission would like the applicant to supply a more detailed site plan. Also, the Municipal Planning Commission would like the owner of the property to be in attendance to address the non-compliance issues that are currently outstanding on the property.

5.6 Development Application 2018-045
Lot coverage & Height waiver for Accessory Structure
2437 Aspen Drive

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

The Town of Coaldale has received a development permit application for detached garage at the above-mentioned address. The applicant is requesting 2 waivers:

- 1. The proposed detached garage at the above-mentioned property would cover 11.5% of the lot whereas the maximum lot coverage allowed is 10%.
- 2. The maximum height allowed for detached garages is 15', whereas 15' 7'' is proposed for the structure at the above-mentioned address.
- There was a question on whether the owner would be willing to reduce the height of the garage to meet the height requirement.
- The owner indicated he wanted to keep the slope of the house.
- If the height were lowered it would comply for both height and coverage.

MOTION: J. Cortes moved to approve Development Application 2018-045 subject to the following conditions:

1. Must obtain approval of a Building Permit form Superior Safety Codes prior to commencement.

- 2. Must contact Alberta 1st Call and Dig Shaw to locate any utility lines prior to commencement.
- 3. Setbacks to conform to site plan that was attached as part of the Development Permit application and to the current Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13, Schedule 2, Residential-R-1A.
- 4. A minimum separation distance of 4 feet shall be provided between a principal building and any accessory building.
- 5. Refuse and or garbage during construction shall be in appropriate containers and shall be properly screened and placed in an approved enclosure until removed for disposal.
- 6. Ensure lot drainage is maintained.
- 7. The building, when completed, shall meet or exceed provincial building requirements and comply with all provincial and municipal health and fire regulations.
- 8. The height of the Detached garage MUST not exceed 15 feet.
- 9. The detached garage MUST not cover more than 10 % of the total lot area.

Mobile Home Park subdivision of Unit 73, Condominium Plan 1413021 within SE1/4 11-9-20-W4M

THAT the Mobile Home Park subdivision of Unit 73, Condominium Plan 1413021 within SE1/4 11-9-20-W4M (Certificate of Title No. 141 301 066 +25), to create eighteen (18) 0.04 ha (0.10 acre) bareland condominium units and one (1) unit for common road property with the Seasons Manufactured Home Community in southeast Coaldale for residential use; <u>BE APPROVED subject to the following</u>:

CONDITIONS:

- 1. That, pursuant to Section 654(1)(d) of the Municipal Government Act, all outstanding property taxes shall be paid to the Town of Coaldale.
- 2. That, pursuant to Section 655(1)(b) of the Municipal Government Act, the applicant or owner or both enter into a Development Agreement with the Town of Coaldale which shall be registered concurrently with the final plan against the title(s) being created.
- 3. That the applicant pays any applicable or outstanding off-site levies and development fees as required by the Town of Coaldale.
- 4. That the applicant provides a copy of a bareland condominium plan from a certified Alberta Land Surveyor.
- 5. That an overland drainage/grading plan, signed by a registered engineer, be provided that is acceptable to the Town of Coaldale with any requirements addressed in the terms of the Development Agreement with the Town.
- 6. That any easements as required by utility companies or the municipality be established prior to finalization.

REASONS:

- 1. The proposed subdivision is consistent with the South Saskatchewan Regional Plan and complies with the Municipal Development Plan, the Seasons Area Structure Plan and Land Use Bylaw.
- 2. The Subdivision Authority is satisfied that the proposed subdivision is suitable for the purpose for which the subdivision is intended pursuant to Section 7 of the Subdivision and Development Regulation.

INFORMATIVE:

- (a) Since the proposed subdivision complies with Section 663(d) of the Municipal Government Act, Reserve is not required. Municipal reserve was previously dealt with and deferred (registered by caveat on Lot 4, Block 1, Plan 101 3475) from the previous block parcel subdivision approval (see ORRSC subdivision file no. 2009-0-052).
- (b) The existing development agreements (2) from 2010 should be reviewed to ensure their applicability pursuant to Section 655(3) of the Municipal Government Act.
- (c) The applicant/owner is advised that other municipal, provincial or federal government or agency approvals may be required as they relate to the subdivision and the applicant/owner is responsible for verifying and obtaining any other approval, permit, authorization, consent or license that may be required to subdivide, develop and/or service the affected land (this may include but is not limited to Alberta Environment and Parks, Alberta Transportation, and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans.)

(d) Thank you for contacting FortisAlberta regarding the above application for subdivision. We have reviewed the plan and determined that no easement is required by FortisAlberta.

FortisAlberta is the Distribution Wire Service Provider for this area. The developer can arrange installation of electrical services for this subdivision through FortisAlberta. Please have the developer contact 310-WIRE (310-94 73) to make application for electrical services.

(e) Alberta Health Services - Kelli Kirkpatrick, Executive Officer:

"After a review of the information provided and an on site visit, this office does not any objections to the proposed subdivision provide that:

- 1. All applicable regulations, standards and bylaws are met.
- 2. No nuisance conditions are created. A nuisance is any condition that is or might be injurious or dangerous to public health, or that might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease.
- 3. There is adequate drainage and infrastructure to properly handle storm water.
- 4. The land being used is suitable for the proposed development.

(f) SMRID - Linda Park, Land Administrator:

"Further to your May 24th, 2018 correspondence, the above-mentioned property is classified as "dry" and is located within the Town of Coaldale."

(g) Alberta Transportation - John Thomas, Development/Planning Technologist:

"Reference your file to create eighteen (18) residential lots (Mobile Home Park) at the above noted location.

The proposal is contrary to Section 14 and subject to the requirements of Section 15(2) of the Subdivision and Development Regulation, being Alberta Regulation 43/2002, ("the regulation").

Alberta Transportation's primary objective is to allow subdivision and development of adjacent properties in a manner that will not compromise the integrity and associated safe operational use or the future expansion of the provincial highway network.

To that end, currently and as proposed, the lots to be created and the remnant land will gain indirect access to the provincial highway network by way of the town's internal street system, which is consistent with the existing access management strategy for this stretch of the highway. Given this, strictly from Alberta Transportation's point of view, we do not anticipate that the creation of the residential lots as proposed will have any appreciable impact on the highways.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 16 of the regulation, in this instance, Alberta Transportation grants a waiver of said Sections 14 and 15(2).

Notwithstanding that the waiver of said Section 15(2) has been granted, the applicant is advised that no direct access will be allowed as a result of this application.

The applicant would also be advised that any development within the right-of-way or within 300 metres beyond the limit of the highway or within 800 metres from the center point of the intersection of the highway and another highway would require the benefit of a permit from our department. This requirement is outlined in the Highways Development and Protection Regulation, being Alberta Regulation 326/2009.

The subject property is within the noted control lines; however, given the site-specific circumstance that development setbacks will be defaulted to the town's side-yard setback requirements, and as all access to the highway is indirect by the town's internal street system, in this instance, a permit from the Alberta Transportation will not be required, and development of the subject property could proceed under the direction, control, and management of the Town of Coaldale subdivision and development land use authority. The applicant could contact the undersigned, at Lethbridge 403/381-5426, in this regard.

Alberta Transportation accepts no responsibility for the noise impact of highway traffic upon any development or occupants thereof. Noise impact and the need for attenuation should be thoroughly assessed. The applicant is advised that provisions for noise attenuation are the sole responsibility of the developer and should be incorporated as required into the subdivision/development design.

Any peripheral lighting (yard lights/area lighting) that may be considered a distraction to the motoring public or deemed to create a traffic hazard will not be permitted.

Further, should the approval authority receive any appeals in regard to this application and as per Section 678(2.1) of the Municipal Government Act and Section 5(5)(d) of the regulation, Alberta Transportation agrees to waive the referral distance for this particular subdivision application. As far as Alberta Transportation is concerned, an appeal of this subdivision application may be heard by the local Subdivision and Development Appeal Board provided that no other provincial agency is involved in the application."

Proposal:

To create eighteen (18) 0.04 ha (0.10 acre) bareland condominium units and one (1) unit for common road property with the Seasons Manufactured Home Community in southeast Coaldale for residential

Planner's Preliminary Comments:

The purpose of this application is to create eighteen (18) 0.04 ha (0.10 acre) bareland condominium units and one (1) unit for common road property within the Seasons Manufactured Home Community in southeast Coaldale for residential use. The subdivision area takes up approximately 0,99 ha (2.45 acre) from a titled area containing 4.31 ha (10.65 acre) and is legally described as Unit 73, Plan 141 3021.

The proposal represents Phase 1C of the Seasons Area Structure Plan (ASP) Bylaw No. 608-P-11-08, approved by Town Council in 2009. The application will create titles (known as units in a condominium scenario) for the future development of single detached manufactured dwellings, which are a permitted use in the Manufactured Home Park – R3 within the Land Use Bylaw. The proposed site layout, density and road network conform to the relevant provisions of the ASP, notably Figure 3.1a, which also acts as a "comprehensive plan" for the purposes of the Manufactured Home Park – R3 District.

Servicing to the development will be provided by way of privately owned connections to municipal infrastructure and the private road network within the Seasons Community. A 3.5 m wide utility right-of-way (Plan 141 3022) was previously dedicated and will support shallow utility services in the front of the units. In accordance with the drainage plan in Figure 4.1c of the ASP stormwater will drain overland from north to south within the roadway (Summer Street) and then east to the culvert in Applewood Road. It is understood that the existing Water Act Approval No. 00262038-00-00 is in effect for all Phase 1 stormwater management works in the Seasons but will be required to be amended for subsequent phases.

As this subdivision proposal conforms to the approved area structure plan for the subject lands, approval may be considered with the following suggested conditions:

- 1. Any outstanding property taxes shall be paid to the Town of Coaldale.
- 2. The applicant or owner or both enter into a Development Agreement with the Town of Coaldale to address any servicing requirements. The existing development agreements (2) from 2010 should be reviewed to ensure their applicability pursuant to Section 655(3) of the Municipal Government Act.
- 3. That the applicant pays any applicable or outstanding off-site levies and development fees as required by the Town of Coaldale.
- 4. That the applicant provides a copy of a bareland condominium plan from a certified Alberta Land Surveyor.
- 5. That an overland drainage/grading plan, signed by a registered engineer, be provided that is acceptable to the Town of Coaldale with any requirements addressed in the terms of the Development Agreement with the Town.
- 6. That any easement(s) as required by utility companies or the municipality shall be established.
- 7. Consideration of referral agencies comments and any requirements.

RESERVE:

Since the proposed subdivision complies with Section 663(d) of the Municipal Government Act municipal reserve is not required. Municipal reserve was previously dealt with and deferred (registered by caveat on Lot 4, Block 1, Plan 101 3475) from the previous block parcel subdivision approval (see ORRSC subdivision file no. 2009-0-052).

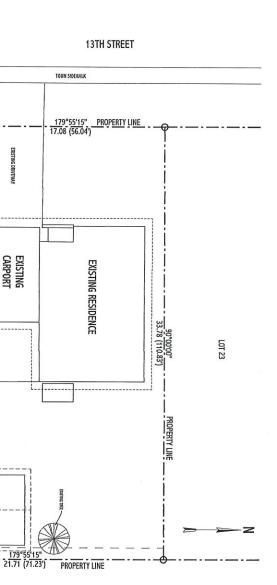
