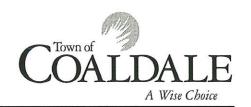

**Development Permit Application 2019-126** 5.1

Front yard waiver

1822 - 10A Street

### **BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:**

C. L'Hirondelle provided an overview of the application for a front yard setback waiver for an existing detached dwelling at 1822 10A Street. In 2007, a development permit was issued for an addition to the front of the existing detached dwelling and a 10% waiver was issued. However, when the addition was constructed the front yard setback measured 6.62m away from the front property line, which is less than the granted 6.86m front yard setback.

The commission questioned if the reason for the build out for the bay window was due to the front stairs

- L. Verhoef noted this house was bought on a foreclosure and as such, the exterior additions were constructed before they bought the house and was inherited when purchased
- The commission indicated that there is a deck that has been added to this property and inquired if a permit has been pulled.
- C. L'Hirondelle noted that a permit has since been applied for and approved for the construction
  of the deck.
- The commission noted that although the addition sticks out on the one side, it is an improvement

5.2 Development Application 2019-127 Side yard waiver 1201 – 33 Avenue

### BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

C. L'Hirondelle presented Development Application 2019-127 noting it is a side yard waiver for an existing single detached dwelling at 1201 33 Avenue. The original permit was issued with a 10% side yard waiver (2.78m). However, once constructed, the pillar on the front veranda had a side yard setback measurement of 2.40m.

- The Commission questioned if the column on the veranda is faced with brick or cultured stone to make it larger
- S. Dyck explained that the building plans show the measurement at the top portion of the pillar being 16" wide but the client wanted a wider base, which was also shown on the plans. However, the measurement shown on the permit was taken from the top of the pillar, not the base.

Proposal:

To subdivide an existing 0.08 ha (0.21 acre) parcel into two parcels,

being approximately 0.04 ha (0.11 acre) each.

### Planner's Preliminary Comments:

The purpose of the application is to subdivide an existing 0.08 ha (0.21 acre) parcel into two parcels, being approximately 0.04 ha (0.11 acre) each. The subject parcel is legally described as Lot 20, Block 3, Plan 941 0225, and is located on 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue between 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> Street.

The subject parcel currently contains a single detached dwelling and multiple accessory buildings. The applicant has plans to remove the buildings on the proposed westerly lot, and redevelop the lot with a new dwelling (bungalow style with rear attached garage). Access and servicing to the lot will be by way of a rear driveway and through connections to existing municipal services lying within the roadway.

At 11.72 m and 11.56 m (slightly less than symmetrical in order to accommodate side yard setbacks for future dwelling) the parcels fall short of the minimum 15.24 m (50 ft.) width required in the R-1A District. The existing dwelling on the easterly lot is to remain, and will meet required setbacks.

To facilitate the redevelopment project, the applicant has also filed an application for rezoning of the subject parcel from R-1A to R-1B (Bylaw 767-P-09-19). The R-1B District, which stipulates a minimum 12.19 m (40 ft.) lot width, and if successful, will better support the redevelopment project. It is noted that although the neighbourhood is predominantly zoned R-1A, the R-1B zoning is bestowed upon the three (3) parcels immediately to the east of the subject parcel. The parcel sizes immediately adjacent to the subject parcel range from 11.65 m (38.2 ft.) – duplex lots to the west – and 15.24 m (50 ft.) – single detached dwelling to the east.

As such the Municipal Planning Commission may consider approval of the application along with the following suggested conditions and considerations:

- 1. Any outstanding property taxes shall be paid to the Town of Coaldale.
- 2. The applicant or owner or both enter into a Development Agreement with the Town of Coaldale to address any municipal servicing requirements.
- 3. That any easement(s) as required by utility companies and/or the municipality shall be established.
- 4. That any conditions of Alberta Transportation are met.
- 5. Waiver of the minimum lot width requirements of the applicable land use district.
- 6. Removal of the existing structures on Lot 'A'.
- 7. Consideration of adjacent landowners and referral agencies comments.

### RESERVE:

Municipal reserve was previously dealt with and is not applicable pursuant to Section 663(c) of the Municipal Government Act (parcel is under 0.8 ha in size).

SUBDIVISION LOCATION SKETCH LOT 20, BLOCK 3, PLAN 9410225

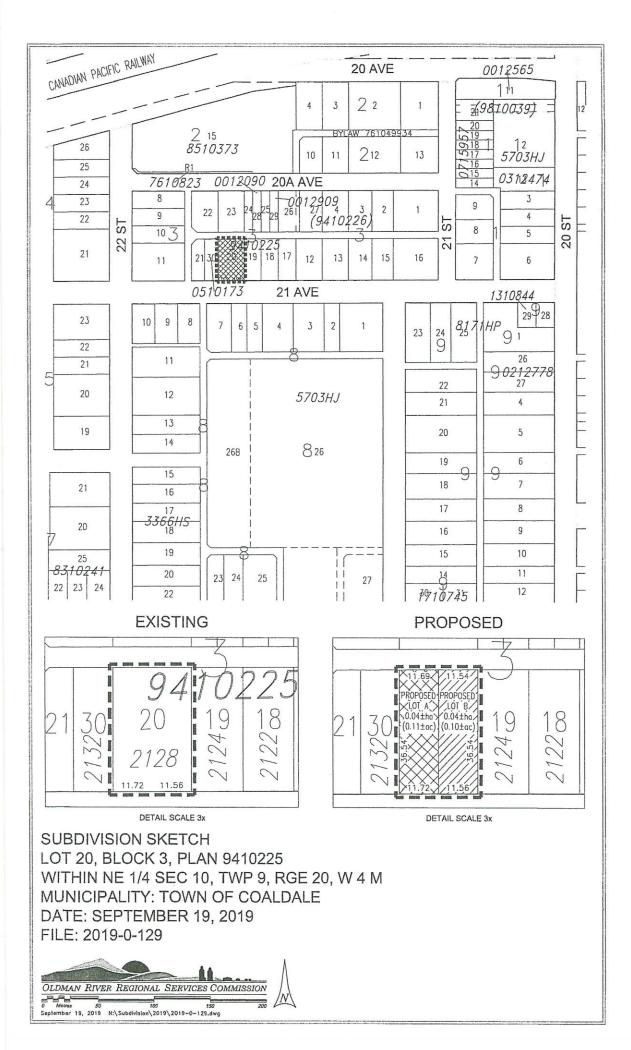

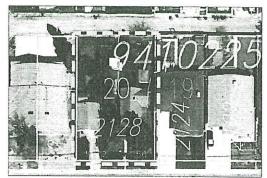

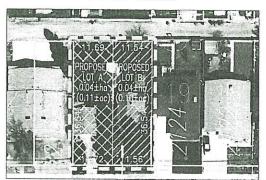

### Staff Report to the Municipal Development Authority Board

### **BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:**

We are in receipt of Development Application 2019-116 to construct two (2) naturalized wetland cells at the above mentioned property. The wetland cells are intended to provide flood relief, recreational area and wildlife habitat. The construction would consist of excavation, pipe work and naturalized revegetation of the disturbed areas.

Town of Coaldale staff have been in consultation with St Mary River Irrigation District (SMRID) and Lethbridge County regarding the project and the impact that it may have on each entity.

### USE AS PER LETHBRIDGE COUNTY BYLAW NO 1404- Public & Private Utilities (see Utility)

Utility means any one or more of the following:

- a) Systems for the distribution of gas, whether artificial or natural;
- b) Waterworks systems (facilities for the storage, transmission, treatment, distribution or supply of water);
- Sewage systems (facilities for the collection, treatment, movement of disposal of sanitary sewage);
- d) Storm sewage drainage facilities;
- e) Telecommunications facilities;
- f) Systems for the distribution of artificial light or electric power;
- g) Facilities used for the storage of telephone, cable, remote weather stations or internet infrastructure; and
- h) Any other things prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council by regulation;

But does not include those systems or facilities referred to in subclause a) through g) that are exempted by the Lieutenant Governor in Council by regulation.

Within the context of this definition, "Public Utility" means a utility that is owned or operated by some level of government, and "Private Utility" means the utility is owned or operated by non-government entity, private company, publicly traded company or utility agency.

Notice of the application was sent to the neighbouring property owners and no written or verbal concerns have been brought forward.

### APPLICABLE SECTIONS OF THE LETHBRIDGE COUNTY LAND USE BYLAW NO 1404:

Land Use Bylaw, Part 2, Rural Urban Fringe (RUF)

### RECOMMENDATION

The board considers APPROVAL of Development Application (2019-116) to establish two naturalized wetland cells on the property legally described as Plan 57JK, Block 2, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The applicant MUST submit a Surface Drainage Plan to ensure water does not drain into adjacent properties. The Surface Drainage Plan MUST include:
  - a. establish the design of the land, including Lots within the development area and in conjunction with adjacent lands surrounding the development area;
  - b. incorporate the preservation and protection of any Environmentally Sensitive Areas abiding by all Acts and Regulations either Federal or Provincial.
- 2. The applicant/owner SHALL enter into an agreement with the Town of Coaldale which will make reference to operational and maintenance requirements, pump operations, pond storage volumes and any other matter that the Town of Coaldale deems necessary <u>prior to</u> <u>commencement</u> of construction The agreement shall be registered on title.
- 3. All construction drawings MUST be approved by the Town before commencement of construction. Once drawings are submitted to the Town of Coaldale, it will take 15 business days for the review to be completed.
- 4. The applicant MUST confirm location of SMRID pipeline location and elevations and submit a signed copy of the ROW agreement to the Town of Coaldale.
- 5. The applicant MUST submit a signed copy of the crossing agreement with Telus to the Town of Coaldale.
- 6. The applicant MUST submit a letter, signed by a professional engineer, stating that the design meets the current Alberta Environment and Parks guidelines. If there are any exceptions, they MUST be outlined clearly in the letter and any reasons why the guidelines were not met.

- 7. The applicant/owner is solely responsible for adhering to all relevant provincial and federal legislation and regulations including the Water Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. W-3, and the Alberta Wetland Policy
- 8. The owner MUST sell and/or transfer the permanent irrigation rights on the property.
- 9. The owner/applicant shall not commence construction until final drawing approval is obtained from the Town of Coaldale, at the owner's expense.
- 10. Excess dirt and mud that is tracked onto sidewalks and roads shall be cleaned up promptly as to not impact any other roadways in the area.
- 11. Complete record drawings MUST be submitted to the Town of Coaldale within three (3) months of project completion.
- 12. A finalized Operations & Maintenance Manual MUST be submitted to the Town of Coaldale within (3) months of project completion.
- 13. Must contact Alberta 1st Call (1-800-242-3447) and Dig Shaw (1-866-344-7429) to locate any utility lines prior to commencement.
- 14. Applicant complies with all parts of the Lethbridge County Land Use Bylaw No 1404, Parts 2,3 and 4.
- 15. If a sign is required, a separate sign application must be submitted to the Town of Coaldale.
- 16. Must obtain approval of a Building Permit from Superior Safety Codes Inc. at (403) 320-0734 prior to commencement, if required.
- 17. The applicant SHALL take effective measures to control dust, flying debris and erosion in the construction area so that it does not become a nuisance, danger, cause damage to property, nor cause unnecessary harm to the environment. The applicant is required to submit a dust, flying debris and erosion control plan designed by an experienced designer for review by the Director of Operations before a letter of permission to construct will be issued.
- 18. The applicant is required to submit an Erosion Control Plan, designed by a Qualified designer for review by the Town of Coaldale prior to a letter to construct will be issued.
- 19. Provide responses and additional information requested in the letter dated, September 19, 2019. All responses and information to be approved by the Town of Coaldale.

### **INFORMATION ITEMS:**

- 1. The owner would need to enter into a Water Conveyance agreement with the irrigation district and have a meter installed if non-potable water was required, at their own expense.
- 2. The owner/applicant would be responsible for any easements, agreements and/or works required to provide water to the area.
- 3. St. Mary River Irrigation District requires that a meter be installed at the point of delivery and the BOP Foundation would be billed on the volume used or a minimum of 10-acre foot, whichever is greater.
- 4. The St. Mary River Irrigation District shall be supplied a copy of the draft agreement for review between the Town of Coaldale and Birds of Prey Foundation detailing how and when the Birds of Prey Foundation would be allowed to discharge water to the existing ponds.
- 5. The St. Mary River Irrigation District shall be supplied with a copy of the Operations and Maintenance Manual for the newly construct naturalized wetland cells.
- 6. The St. Mary River Irrigation District shall be at the yearly start-up meeting between the Birds of Prey Foundation and the Town of Coaldale regarding the operation of the wetlands.

The board may consider REFUSAL of Development Application (#2019-116).

By definition, wetland cells would fall under the use of Public and Private Utilities which is a discretionary use within the Rural Urban Fringe – RUF zoning in the Lethbridge County Land Use Bylaw No. 1404. The newly annexed property is currently zoned with a Lethbridge County zoning therefore that is the bylaw that is referred to for the application.

USE AS PER LETHBRIDGE COUNTY BYLAW NO 1404- Public & Private Utilities (see Utility)

Utility means any one or more of the following:

- a) Systems for the distribution of gas, whether artificial or natural;
- b) Waterworks systems (facilities for the storage, transmission, treatment, distribution or supply of water);
- c) Sewage systems (facilities for the collection, treatment, movement of disposal of sanitary sewage);
- d) Storm sewage drainage facilities;
- e) Telecommunications facilities;
- f) Systems for the distribution of artificial light or electric power;
- g) Facilities used for the storage of telephone, cable, remote weather stations or internet infrastructure; and
- h) Any other things prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council by regulation; But does not include those systems or facilities referred to in subclause a) through g) that are exempted by the Lieutenant Governor in Council by regulation.

Within the context of this definition, "Public Utility" means a utility that is owned or operated by some level of government, and "Private Utility" means the utility is owned or operated by non-government entity, private company, publicly traded company or utility agency.

### **RURAL URBAN FRINGE - RUF**

### PURPOSE

### 3. MINIMUM LOT SIZE

- (1) The minimum required parcel or lot size shall be:
  - (a) existing parcels;
  - (b) 0.8 ha (2 acres) of developable land or greater as reasonably required to support the proposed use.
- (2) Parcels or lots less than 0.8 ha (2 acres) in size may be considered in the following circumstances:
  - (a) the lots are to be connected to municipal services; or
  - (b) the lots are included in a municipal approved area structure plan or design scheme and the lot area is based on an alternative or communal waste water treatment system acceptable to the municipality. In such situations, the minimum lot area should not be less than 0.2 ha (20,000 sq. ft.) unless special circumstances warrant a smaller size.

### 4. MINIMUM YARD SETBACK REQUIREMENTS

(1) No structure (excluding fencing) or dugout banks shall be within 6.1 metres (20 ft.) of a property line. For setbacks adjacent to or fronting roadways, the following Section 5 stipulations shall apply.

### (2) Special Setback Requirements

All buildings, structures and development other than extensive cultivation or grazing on parcels having frontage on a provincial highway may have special requirements for setback, access and service roadways imposed as a condition of approval by the Development Authority in accordance with the requirements of Alberta Transportation and the *Highways Development Protection Regulation*.

<sup>\*</sup> May be allowed with compliance to Part 1, Section 18 of this bylaw.

<sup>\*\* &</sup>quot;Non-designated" means a cluster or grouping of such uses that has not been designated as such in the land use bylaw.



### 5. MINIMUM SETBACKS FROM ROADWAYS

- (1) No part of a building, structure or development shall be located within:
  - (a) 38.1 metres (125 ft.) of the centre line of any public roadway which is not designated as a provincial highway under the *Highways Development Protection Regulation*;
  - (b) 70.0 metres (230 ft.) of the centre line or 40.0 metres (131 ft.) from the right-of-way boundary, whichever is greater, of roads designated as provincial highways under the *Highways Development Protection Regulation*;
  - (c) for any development adjacent to provincial roadways classified as a four-lane divided highway or freeways/expressways, the required setback distances and accesses will be reviewed on a highway-by-highway/development-by-development basis and shall be as prescribed by Alberta Transportation;
  - (d) any greater distance that may be required by the Development Authority in order to facilitate future road widening, service road dedication, to reduce potential snow drifting, or vision restrictions.
- (2) Where any parcel or part of a parcel has frontage on a provincial highway, special standards for setbacks, access, and service roadways may be required by Alberta Transportation under the *Highways Development Protection Regulation*.
- (3) Landscaping and dugout setbacks shall be at the discretion of the Development Authority having consideration for future road widening and possible adverse effects on the safety of the roadway.

### 6. MINIMUM SETBACKS FOR USES INVOLVING LIVESTOCK OR ANIMALS

- (1) All corrals, feeders, shelters or other structures for the feeding of animals less than the numbers outlined in the *Agricultural Operations and Practices Amendment Act 2001 and Regulations* shall not be located closer to a neighbouring residence than 30.5 metres (100 ft.).
- (2) All corrals, feeders, shelters or other structures for the feeding of animals less than the numbers outlined in the *Agricultural Operations and Practices Amendment Act 2001 and Regulations* shall not be located within 30.5 metres (100 ft.) of the boundary or right-of-way an irrigation district canal, creek, stream, river, lake shore or water body.

### 7. DEVELOPMENT AND SETBACKS NEAR CANALS

All other development shall not be located within 30.5 metres (100 ft.) of the boundary of a right-of-way of an irrigation canal that serves any downstream users. In order to determine the status of a canal, the comments of the relevant irrigation district should be considered.

### 8. MAXIMUM SITE COVERAGE

- (1) Unless specified elsewhere in this bylaw, the maximum percentage of the site that may be covered by buildings and structures shall be as determined by the Development Authority. No building, structure or driveway shall be located within the area or setbacks required or identified to treat private septic sewage.
- (2) At the discretion of the Development Authority, the maximum size (i.e. square footage or building footprint) of an accessory building or structure to be located on a parcel may be stipulated as a condition of approval on a development permit.



### 9. ACCESS

- (1) The municipality may, at the time of subdivision or development, require the developer to enter into an agreement for the construction of any approach(es) necessary to serve the lot or development area in accordance with Lethbridge County Engineering Guidelines and Minimum Servicing Standards.
- (2) To ensure proper emergency access, all developments shall have direct legal and developed physical access to a public roadway in accordance with *Lethbridge County Engineering Guidelines and Minimum Servicing Standards*. If the development is within 304.8 metres (¼ mile) of a provincial highway, direct legal and physical access to a public roadway shall be to the satisfaction of Alberta Transportation.
- (3) Access points adjacent to blind corners, hills, ridges, railway crossings and any other obstructions shall be positioned so as to provide a reasonably unobstructed view in either direction of 100 metres (328 ft.) on a local road.
- (4) The requirement of a service road or subdivision street to provide access may be imposed as a condition of approval for any new development other than those deemed approved. Construction and survey costs for a service road shall be the responsibility of the applicant.
- (5) If access is required onto a roadway under the jurisdiction of an adjacent municipality, the affected municipality shall be notified to obtain consent. In the case where an Intermunicipal Development Plan is adopted by the two municipalities, any applicable road network/access policies stipulated in that joint agreement shall apply.

### 10. ACCESSORY BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

- (1) An accessory building or structure shall only be constructed in conjunction with an approved principal building or use and not be used as a <u>permanent</u> dwelling.
- (2) An accessory building or structure shall not be located in the required setback from a public road or on an easement.
- (3) An accessory building or structure shall be setback a minimum 3.0 metres (10 ft.) from the principal dwelling and from all other structures on the same lot.
- (4) Where a structure is attached to the principal building on a site by a roof, an open or enclosed structure, a floor or foundation, it is to be considered a part of the principal building and is not an accessory building.
- (5) As a condition of a permit, if a development approval is required, the Development Authority may stipulate specific requirements for the type of foundation, fastening or tie-down system, finish, colour, roof pitch, and materials to be applied to the accessory building or structure.

### 11. FENCES AND SHELTERBELTS

In rural areas along local roads, the construction or erection of a fence, hedge or shelterbelt shall comply with the following:

- (a) no fence, hedge or shelterbelt shall be erected which would unduly restrict the vision of approaching traffic;
- (b) fencing surrounding public utility lots shall be as per *Lethbridge County Engineering Guidelines and Minimum Servicing Standards* or as stipulated in a Development Agreement;
- (c) all fences must be sited to be able to meet the required corner site triangle setbacks as stipulated in Part 3, Section 11.



- (d) a chain link, split rail or barb wire type fence may be located adjacent to the property line or within the required setbacks to a public road, but, solid material fences and snow fences must meet the stipulated setbacks to the public road;
- (e) no hedge or shelterbelt shall be erected closer than the distances as stipulated in Part 3, Section 11, Fences, Trees and Shelter Belts in Rural Areas, Diagram 3.5, of the right-of-way of a public road.

### 12. OBJECTS PROHIBITED OR RESTRICTED IN YARDS

- (1) No person shall allow a motor vehicle which has all or part of its superstructure removed, or a motor vehicle which is in a dilapidated or unsightly condition to remain within 30.5 metres (100 ft.) of a local road or provincial highway in the district unless it is suitably housed or screened to the satisfaction of the Development Authority.
- (2) Not more than six (6) recreational vehicles shall be stored or parked on a parcel unless otherwise approved by the Development Authority.
- (3) A recreational vehicle parked on a lot in any district shall not be used for permanent living or sleeping accommodation.

### 13. SERVICING REQUIREMENTS

- (1) Every development shall be required to install a sewage disposal system and potable water system in accordance with *Lethbridge County Engineering Guidelines and Minimum Servicing Standards* or other system as approved by the municipality.
- (2) The Development Authority may refuse a development, and the Subdivision Authority may refuse to approve a subdivision, if the parcel on which it is proposed is not large enough or does not have suitable soil characteristics to support a sewage disposal system to the standard required.
- (3) The Development Authority may refuse a development, and the Subdivision Authority may refuse to approve a subdivision, if it cannot be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the approval authority that the parcel has access to a secure potable water source or system.

### 14. LOCATIONAL CRITERIA FOR ISOLATED COUNTRY RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT

- (1) Isolated country residential development shall be discouraged if located within:
  - (a) the minimum distance separation as calculated from an existing or approved confined feeding operation;
  - (b) the required (reciprocal) setback distance of noxious industries or resource extraction uses to residential or higher density urban uses; or
  - (c) the required or recommended safe setback distance to hazardous, ecologically sensitive, or other geographical sensitive features (coulees, steep slopes, escarpment, floodplains or flood prone areas, drainage courses, water bodies) in accordance with the bylaw standards, or accepted engineering reports at the discretion of the Development Authority; or
  - (d) any other activity potentially detrimental to a residential environment;

unless the Development Authority or Subdivision and Development Appeal Board is satisfied that adequate measures will be undertaken to mitigate any nuisance or hazard, or the Development Authority determines that there is no other reasonable alternative or available area on the parcel of land in which to suitably locate the dwelling.



(2) In all instances, a development permit application for a residential dwelling shall not be approved if it is located within 500 metres (1,640 ft.) of an established Anhydrous Ammonia bulk storage facility.

### 15. HAZARDOUS OR NOXIOUS INDUSTRY

Development of hazardous or noxious uses shall be discouraged in this land use district.

### 16. DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION REFERRALS

- (1) Development applications for discretionary uses within this land use district shall be referred to (where relevant) the Development Authority of the Town of Coaldale, Town of Picture Butte, Town of Coalhurst, Village of Barons, or the Village of Nobleford for comment, prior to making a decision on a permit application.
- (2) Pursuant to the Lethbridge County Municipal Development Plan, the Development Authority may take into account the direct or indirect effects of development applications within this land use district on the immediate and surrounding areas, as well as the possible effect on future development of the Town of Coaldale, Town of Picture Butte, Town of Coalhurst, Village of Barons and Village of Nobleford as applicable.
- (3) In areas of the Town of Coalhurst rural urban fringe, applications may be referred to the City of Lethbridge in accordance with any applicable Intermunicipal Development Plan policies.
- (4) Land use policies, development restrictions or standards stipulated in any adopted Intermunicipal Development Plan with a neighbouring municipality, which are applicable to the rural urban fringe area, shall take precedence over any policy or standard in this bylaw.

### 18. STANDARDS OF DEVELOPMENT (See Part 3 – General Land Use Provisions)

- (1) Part 3 contains land use and development standards that may be required and stipulated as a condition of a subdivision or development approval.
- (2) All development must comply with any additional standards that may be contained in an adopted area structure plan or design scheme.
- 19. LANDSCAPING AND SCREENING (See Part 3 General Land Use Provisions)
- 20. OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS (See Part 3 General Land Use Provisions)
- 21. USE SPECIFIC STANDARDS OF DEVELOPMENT (See Part 4 Use Specific Provisions)
- 22. READY-TO-MOVE / MANUFACTURED HOME DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS (See Part 4 Use Specific Provisions)
- 23. MOVED-IN DWELLINGS AND BUILDINGS (See Part 4 Use Specific Provisions)
- 24. HOME OCCUPATIONS (See Part 4 Use Specific Provisions)
- 25. SIGN REGULATIONS (See Part 5)

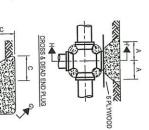




TRENCH WIDTH AS DETERMINED BY INSTALLATION METHOD

- 7. The building, when completed, shall meet or exceed provincial building requirements and comply with all provincial and municipal health and fire regulations.

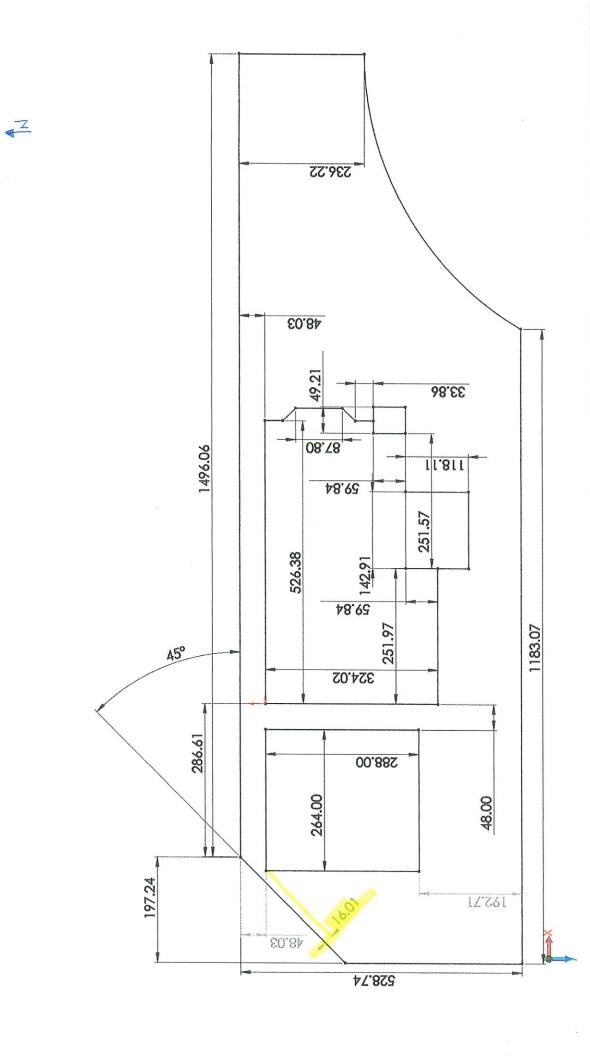

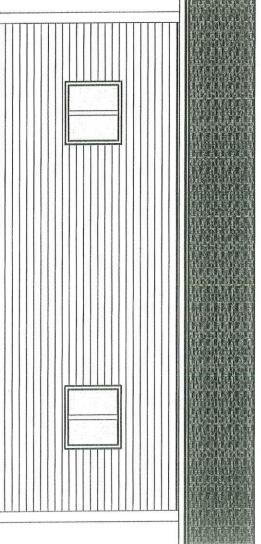


# SOUTH SIDE-EAVE SIDE 1 ELEVATION

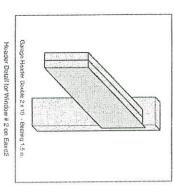

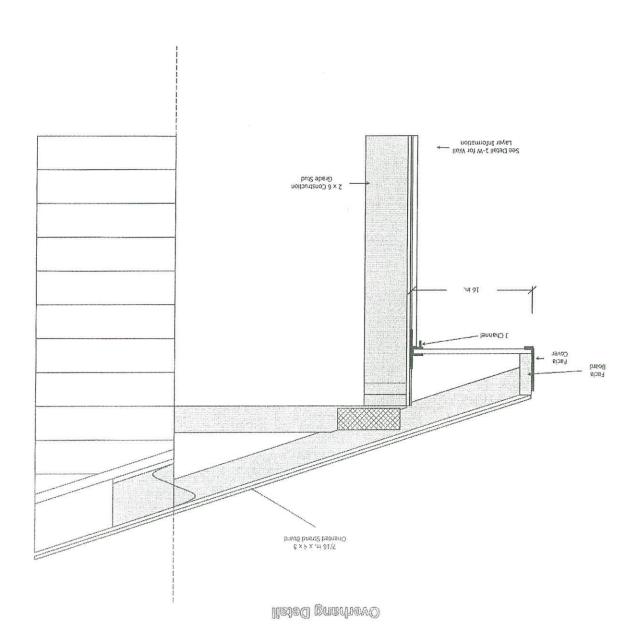


## GARAGE FLOOR PLAN

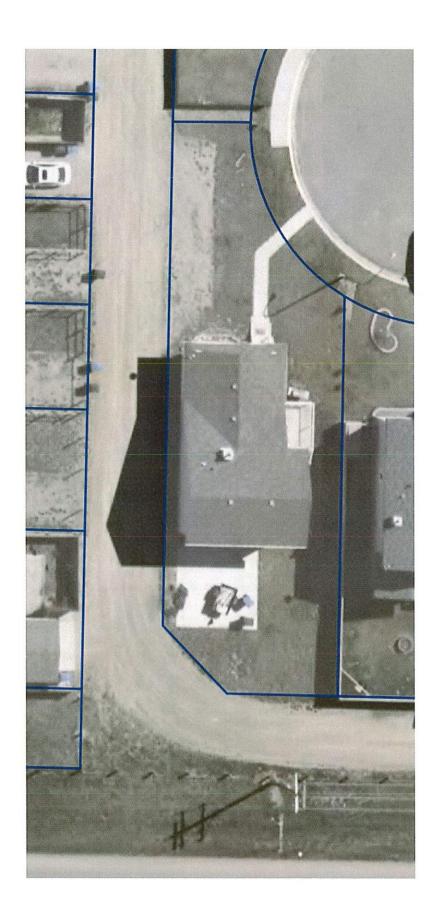

### BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

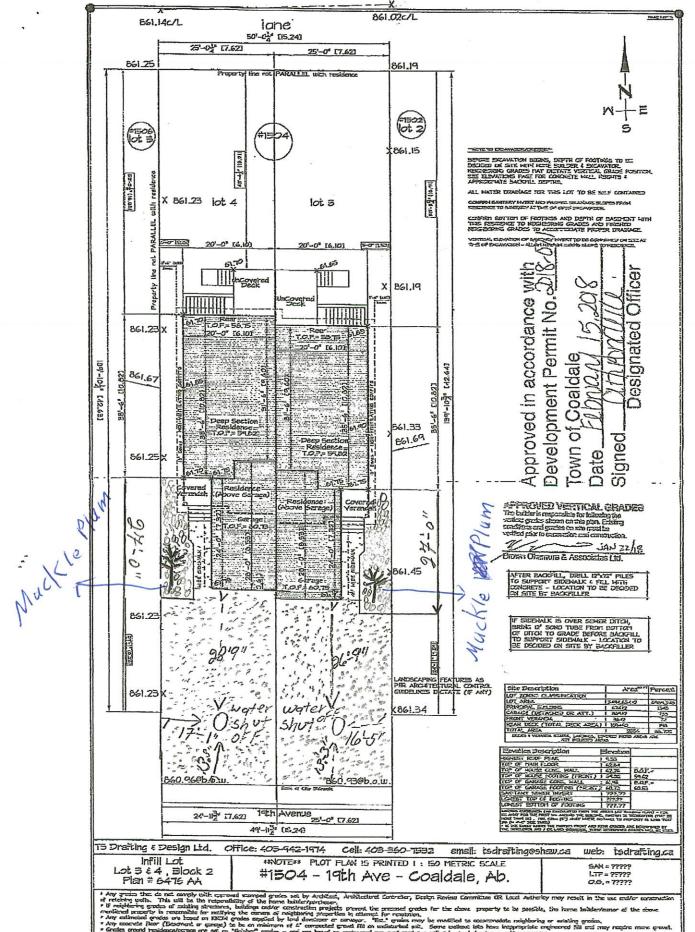
