1.0 CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

Chairman J. Van Rijn called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

2.0 ADDITIONS TO / ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

MOTION: R. Pitsol moved to adopt the agenda.

3-0 CARRIED

3.0 ADOPTION OF MINUTES:

- 3.1 Municipal Planning Commission Minutes July 12, 2017
- R. Pitsol noted on Page 4 of the minutes, line 5 the word should be sloped.
- R. Dyck noted 5.1 should be Subdivision Application not Development Application.

MOTION: J. Abrey moved to approve the July 12, 2017 minutes as amended.

3-0 CARRIED

4.0 BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES: None

5.0 NEW BUSINESS:

5.1 Development Application 2017-120 Front Yard Waiver 2112 – 9th Street

C. L'Hirondelle, Development and Environmental Services Manager, presented the Commission with Development Application 2017-120.

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

The above mentioned property currently has a single-detached dwelling on it with newer concrete front steps. The applicant would like to cover his existing from steps and entry way with a roof that is supported by pillars.

When an older subdivision, such as this lot was a part of, the easement at the front of the property was not included within the property line therefore adding more frontage from the back of the sidewalk to actual property line (approximately 6' for the above mentioned property).

At the above mentioned address, they are asking to cover the front steps that are 19' - 9'' away from the property line and 26' away from the back of sidewalk.

Notice of the application was sent to adjacent properties and no written or verbal concerns have been brought forward to date.

- C. L'Hirondelle noted they applicant is seeking a front yard waiver of five feet, three inches.
- R. Dyck said it could almost fall under the permitted projections into the setback, what is described as an unenclosed step. It is more of a porch type thing. He noted there are exceptions for projections into the setback up to five feet for unenclosed steps.
- P. Janzen said he is building it to enhance the property and it is not enclosed. It is not a fire hazard. It is designed to add to the appeal of the home.
- R. Pitsol asked if there would be hand rails.
- P. Janzen said no railing but a couple of flower pots.
- J. Van Rijn asked if there had been any response from neighbours.
- C. L'Hirondelle said no comments were received on this application.
- P. Janzen provided the commission with a photograph of what he intends to build and how it lines up with the neighbour's property.
- J. Van Raalte, a neighbour to Janzen, said the changes would line up the front of the Janzen home with his own home and he had no problem with that.

MOTION: J. Abrey moved Development Application 2017-120 be approved subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS:

- Must obtain <u>approval</u> of a Building Permit from Superior Safety Codes Inc at (403) 320-0734 <u>prior</u> to commencement.
- 2. Must contact Alberta 1st Call (1-800-242-3447) and Dig Shaw (1-866-344-7429) to locate any utility lines *prior* to commencement.
- 3. Setbacks to conform to site plan that was attached as part of the Development Permit application and to the current Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13, Schedule 2, Residential R-1A.
- 4. Refuse and or garbage during construction shall be in appropriate containers and shall be properly screened and placed in an approved enclosure until removed for disposal.
- 5. Excess dirt and mud that is tracked onto sidewalks and roads shall be cleaned up promptly as to not impact the neighbourhood.

5.2 Development Application 2017-122

Temporary Sign – Time extension West of McDonalds

C. L'Hirondelle, Development and Environmental Services Manager, presented the Commission with Development Application 2017-122.

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

We are in receipt of a Development Application (#2017-122) to display a temporary sign at the above referenced property.

Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13 states that a development permit for a portable sign shall be valid for a period of no longer than 60 days. The Land Use Bylaw also states that once the permit has expired for a portable sign at a location address, application for another portable sign on the same site shall not occur until 30 days has elapsed from the expiration of the previously approved permit or 30 days from the date at which the portable sign is removed, whichever is the later of the two dates.

A request has been made for a 120 day time extension waiver which would allow the sign to be displayed continuously for a total of 210 days (7 months).

The Town of Coaldale Land-Use Bylaw states that waivers exceeding 10% of any measurable standard shall be considered by the Municipal Planning Commission (MPC). As such, a hearing must be held for consideration of this application. Notice of the application was sent to neighbouring property owners. We have not had any written or verbal concerns brought forward.

APPLICABLE SECTIONS OF THE LAND USE BYLAW:

- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 2, Highway Commercial C-2
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 13, Sign Regulations
- C. L'Hirondelle said the Coaldale Copperheads are seeking a time extension for just over seven months for their regular season plus the playoffs. She noted there are photos in the agenda package which show the upgrades to the sign.
- J. Van Rijn said they are adding to the time frame in order to cover the entire hockey season.
- R. Pitsol said he has a concern with the hockey sticks on the sign and whether they would be a target for vandalism.
- K. Wiebe said the sticks are put on with welded metal brackets to secure them to the sign due to the windy conditions in the area. She also noted Kustom Auto Body is also doing the painting so it will also weather well.
- J. Van Rijn said it will be a big improvement to the old sign.
- K. Wiebe said having the hockey sticks on the sign will also indicate it is about hockey.

MOTION: R. Pitsol moved Development Application 2017-122 be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The sign must be removed on or before April 10, 2018
- 2. The portable sign is to be non-illuminated and the position of the sign will not impede the vision of drivers.
- 3. The sign shall not project or overhang onto public property.

5.3 Development Application 2017-123 Home Occupation 2 2105-16th Avenue

C. L'Hirondelle, Development and Environmental Services Manager, presented the Commission with Development Application 2017-123.

BACKGROUND/DESCRIPTION OF APPLICATION:

We are in receipt of Development Application 2017-123 to establish a Home Occupation 2 for the purpose of counselling services at the above referenced property.

- Clients are by appointment
- Hours of operation Monday thru Friday 1:00pm 8:00 pm.
- 2 parking stalls provided by the existing driveway remaining would be on-street parking.

The Town of Coaldale Land-Use Bylaw states that a Home Occupation 2 is a Discretionary Use in the Residential – R-1A zoning. As such, a hearing must be held by the Municipal Planning Commission (MPC) of the Town of Coaldale for consideration of the application.

Notice of the application was sent to the neighbouring property owners and no written or verbal concerns have been brought forward.

APPLICABLE SECTIONS OF THE LAND USE BYLAW:

- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 2, Residential R-1A
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 7, Home Occupations

Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13, Schedule 7 – Home Occupations, Section 3 – General Standards, Sub-Section (h) states:

"Home Occupations shall not generate vehicular traffic or parking, in excess of that which is characteristic of the district within it is located."

Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13, Schedule 7 – Home Occupations, Section 3 – General Standards, Sub-Section (q)(ii) states:

"Home Occupations shall not include any use that would, in the opinion of the Development Authority, materially interfere with or affect the use, enjoyment or value of the neighbouring properties."

- C. L'Hirondelle noted the business will operate by appointment only so there won't be a huge influx of people.
- J. Van Rijn noted the applicant was in attendance.
- M. Hofsink said she was open to any questions.
- C. L'Hirondelle said no comments were received from the neighbours.
- R. Dyck questioned if the hours of operation were the same as those noted in the proposed conditions.
- C. L' Hirondelle said Condition No. 4 should read Monday to Friday 1 to 8 p.m. not 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

MOTION: J. Abrey moved Development Application 2017-123 be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Applicant complies with the Land Use Bylaw No 677-P-04-13, Schedule 7, Home Occupations District;
- 2. Development Permit #2017-018 may be revoked at any time if, in the opinion of the Development Authority, the use is or has become detrimental to the amenities of the neighborhood.
- 3. Applicant applies to the Town of Coaldale for a Business License.
- 4. Hours of operation will be: Monday through Friday 1:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- 5. By appointment only
- 6. At no time shall there be a surplus of vehicles parked on or in front of the subject property to ensure there will be no traffic or parking problems within the neighbourhood.
- 7. A separate sign application must be submitted to the Town of Coaldale.

5.4 Development Application 2017-126
Medical/Health facility
2108 Land O' Lakes Drive

C. L'Hirondelle, Development and Environmental Services Manager, presented the Commission with Development Application 2017-126.

We are in receipt of Development Application 2017-126 to construct a new commercial building for the purpose of a medical facility (dental office), and 2 commercial/retail units, at the above location.

The Town of Coaldale Land-Use Bylaw states that medical/health facility in the Highway Commercial – C2 land use district is a discretionary use. As such, a hearing must be held by the Municipal development Authority (MDA) board of the Town of Coaldale for consideration of the application.

The application requires specific consideration of the following site elements:

- 27 parking stalls required, including 3 barrier-free (38 stalls have been provided as submitted)
- Maximum site coverage permitted is 50% (24% coverage as submitted)
- Maximum building height permitted is 10 m (7.8 m maximum height as submitted)

- ALL yard setbacks have been met as submitted
- A 6 m landscaping buffer is required for all parts of the site facing municipal roadways
 - The north-facing portion of the site provides a 6.07 m landscaped buffer
 - The east-facing portion of the site provides a 3.05 m landscaped buffer (This is 2.95 m narrower than required)
- Site landscaping requirements include 1 tree for every 35 m2 of landscaped area
 - The proposal shows 528 m2 of landscaped area, which would require a total of 15 trees.
 (The proposal as submitted shows 4 trees (11 short), and 84 shrubs)

Points for consideration by the MSDA

- Regarding the landscaping requirements not being met, the Board could consider requiring the removal of parking stalls to include additional trees, in order to make up the shortage of 11 trees
- Should the Board wish to avoid affecting the proposed parking plan, there may be merit in permitting the 4 trees and 84 shrubs, as proposed
- Should the Board wish to address the 2.95 m shortfall of landscaped buffer width on the east property boundary, there may be merit in requiring additional hard landscaping elements such as rock groupings, or additional plantings in the form of shrubs and trees, in the area that is currently identified as grass-only
- Consideration should also be given to the fact that the utility r-o-w, especially on the north boundary of the site, is well utilized and the landscaping must account for the multiple existing utility boxes. This can create difficulties with meeting the requirements for specific landscaping regulations, such as the number of trees on-site

Notice of the application was sent to the neighbouring property owners and no written or verbal concerns have been brought forward as of the date of the preparation of this report.

APPLICABLE SECTIONS OF THE LAND USE BYLAW:

- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 2, Highway Commercial C2
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 4, Standards of Development
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 9, Landscaping and Amenity Areas Guidelines
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 10, Industrial, Commercial and Warehousing
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 11, Off-street Parking and Loading Requirements
- Land Use Bylaw, Schedule 13, Sign Regulations
- C. L'Hirondelle noted this is a new commercial building. The dental office is discretionary use and there are two other commercial units. She said there was no correspondence from neighbouring properties. Alberta Transportation also sent an email noting they do not require anything on this development.
- R. Dyck questioned the landscaping and asked if the applicant had indicated why there was a shortfall in the number of trees. He noted there is a strip on the east side with no shrubs and that could be used for additional trees.
- C L'Hirondelle said it may be a line of sight issue on the east side.
- R. Pitsol questioned how close the trees will be to the intersection. He raised a concern about the number of vehicles using that road and the possible obstruction at the corner.
- C. L'Hirondelle said the front property line is not all the way to the curb, it is setback.
- R. Pitsol questioned where the sidewalk is.
- C. L'Hirondelle clarified where the sidewalk is and how it relates to the development.

- R. Pitsol said he is concerned when the shrubs grow they will become an obstruction, especially for those trying to turn at the corner.
- R. Dyck said that is why there is a corner cut on the property, for sight line sake.
- R. Pitsol questioned whether it wouldn't be an issue in six years when everything has grown.
- R. Dyck said he didn't think it will impact the sight lines. He asked for the GIS to be pulled up to review the area in questioned.
- J. Abrey asked if there was another opening for another driveway, which was his concern.
- R. Dyck said no there won't be another driveway. He suggested some additional landscaping, such as a couple of boulders could break up the east side.
- R. Pitsol said going toward Westgate there are trees in the six foot grass boulevard. He said with this development there is room for more trees.
- J. Van Rijn said he thinks the applicant's concern is about visibility.
- R. Pitsol questioned if that was so the business could be seen from the street.
- J. Van Rijn said that is why they are opting out of trees and going for more shrubs.
- R. Pitsol suggested removing one of the parking stalls, as it is a tight turn, and that would make room for another full size tree.
- R. Dyck said that would work.
- J. Van Rijn questioned if they would still be within the parameters of the required 27 parking stalls.
- R. Dyck said they have 38, including 8 in the rear that would be for staff. This would still leave 29 for customers if one were removed.
- C. L'Hirondelle pulled up the GIS and indicated where the new road alignment is and where the sidewalks are located.
- R. Pitsol questioned where the sidewalk ends.
- C. L'Hirondelle said there is nothing to the West, past the church
- R. Dyck asked if there is still the same width of boulevard
- C' L'Hirondelle said no, it was shifted south similar to what is on Land O' Lakes Drive.
- R. Pitsol described how he would like to see one of the stalls removed as it creates a tight turn.
- D. Tonin questioned where the entrance to the property will be and raised an issue with turning.
- J. Van Rijn said there is nothing that will be changed on the street.
- D. Tonin questioned if there would be more than one entrance to this property as it would cause more congestion.
- C. L' Hirondelle said the one entrance is more to the middle of the property. People will be able to turn left or right into the property.
- D. Tonin questioned if it would cause problems in the future with traffic. He said the median is a little long and causes some issues.
- J. Van Rijn said if that is a concern in the future, he can bring it back to the MPC.
- J. Van Rijn said he assumed the reason they want to cut back on the number of trees is visibility.
- R. Dyck it would have been nice to know why they want to cut back.
- R. Pitsol noted McDonalds has a setback of about 20 feet and they have quite a few trees along the drive thru.
- R. Dyck noted McDonalds also got a similar waiver for the number of trees.
- C. L'Hirondelle said they were also short some landscaping as well.
- R. Dyck said they were also short on a width measure.
- J. Abrey also questioned if Stop N Go was also granted a waiver on its trees.
- C. L'Hirondelle with the Stop N Go trees it is on town property but the number of trees counted toward what they required.
- R. Dyck said he agreed with R. Pitsol's comment about parking stall No. 12, it could be a bit tricky.

- R. Dyck said it looks like there has been a lot of thought put into the site plan. He just wonders about the landscaping and he agreed with R. Pitsol about the one stall that should be removed.
- R. Pitsol questioned if the MPC could suggest changes.
- J. Van Rijn noted they are adding more shrubs, but less trees.
- C. L'Hirondelle noted they have proposed a lot more landscaping then usually comes with this type of application.
- R. Dyck said there isn't a designation for a minimum number of shrubs required but there is for the number of trees. He suggested some more could be done on the east side.
- R. Pitsol said it may be to give the businesses a better view out.
- R. Dyck said something decorative as opposed to grass could be added. He said overall it is a pretty positive application.
- J. Van Rijn said in order to take into account the recommendations, can it be approved with a conditions to provide additional landscaping plans?
- R. Dyck suggested a condition of approval could be that a revised landscaping plan be submitted.
- R. Pitsol said it will give them some options.
- R. Dyck said the MPC is not trying to take a hard line, just asking them to consider some changes. It could come back to staff to approve.
- J. Van Rijn questioned how it could be worded to be included in the conditions.
- R. Dyck said it could be worded to take in the recommendations from the MPC.
- R. Pitsol said there is also a great opportunity for a family restaurant with an open patio in this area.

MOTION: R. Pitsol moved Development Application 2017-126 be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Applicant complies with the Land Use Bylaw No 677-P-04-13, Schedules 2, 4, 9, 10, 11 and 13;
- 2. Must obtain <u>approval</u> of a Building Permit from Superior Safety Codes Inc at (403) 320-0734 prior to commencement.
- 3. Must contact Alberta 1st Call (1-800-242-3447) and Dig Shaw (1-866-344-7429) to locate any utility lines *prior* to commencement.
- Setbacks to conform to the site plan that was attached as part of the Development Permit
 application and to the current Land Use Bylaw 677-P-04-13, Schedule 2, Highway Commercial –
 C2 requirements.
- 5. Applicant shall obtain a Town of Coaldale business license prior to commencement.
- 6. Applicant/Owner shall contact the fire department at 403-345-1330 and arrange for a fire inspection prior to commencement.
- 7. Applicant/Owner shall receive approval from Alberta Health Services prior to a Town of Coaldale business license being issued.
- 8. A person to whom a Development Permit for a Commercial Building has been issued shall provide the Designated Officer prior to construction a letter from a qualified Alberta Land Surveyor confirming that a qualified Alberta Land Surveyor conducted the Stakeout of the site for construction.

- 9. Must obtain a competent Alberta Land Surveyor to establish the vertical grades and cuts <u>prior</u> to the excavation of the foundation.
- 10. The applicant/ owner shall comply with Land Use Bylaw No. 677-P-04-13, Schedule 11, Off-Street Parking & Loading Requirements.
- 11. Owner/applicant shall enter into a Development Agreement with the Town of Coaldale which may make reference to the provision of servicing and any other matter that the Town of Coaldale deems necessary *prior to commencement*. Agreement shall be registered on title.
- 12. Refuse and or garbage during construction shall be in appropriate containers and shall be properly screened and placed in an approved enclosure until removed for disposal. CONTAINERS SHALL NOT BE PLACED ON THE TOWN STREET OR LANEWAY.
- 13. A refundable landscaping fee in the amount of <u>\$1,000.00</u> shall be required to ensure the completion of landscaping for street frontage to the satisfaction of the Town of Coaldale. The lot shall be comprehensively landscaped as per a revised landscaping plan that shall consider the elimination of stall No. 12 (replaced with a quarter circle concrete island and tree, mirror of the other side) and additional landscaping in the east landscaping area to the satisfaction of the Development and Environmental Services Manager.
- 14. Ensure water does not drain into neighbouring properties.
- 15. For safe work-site purposes, it is recommended that the civic address of the site be displayed so it is visible from the street at all times during construction in the event that emergency services personnel are called to attend the site.
- 16. Excess dirt and mud that is tracked onto sidewalks and roads shall be cleaned up promptly as to not impact the neighbourhood.

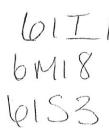

We in fact were recognized as a Communities in Bloom-Yard of the Week this year.

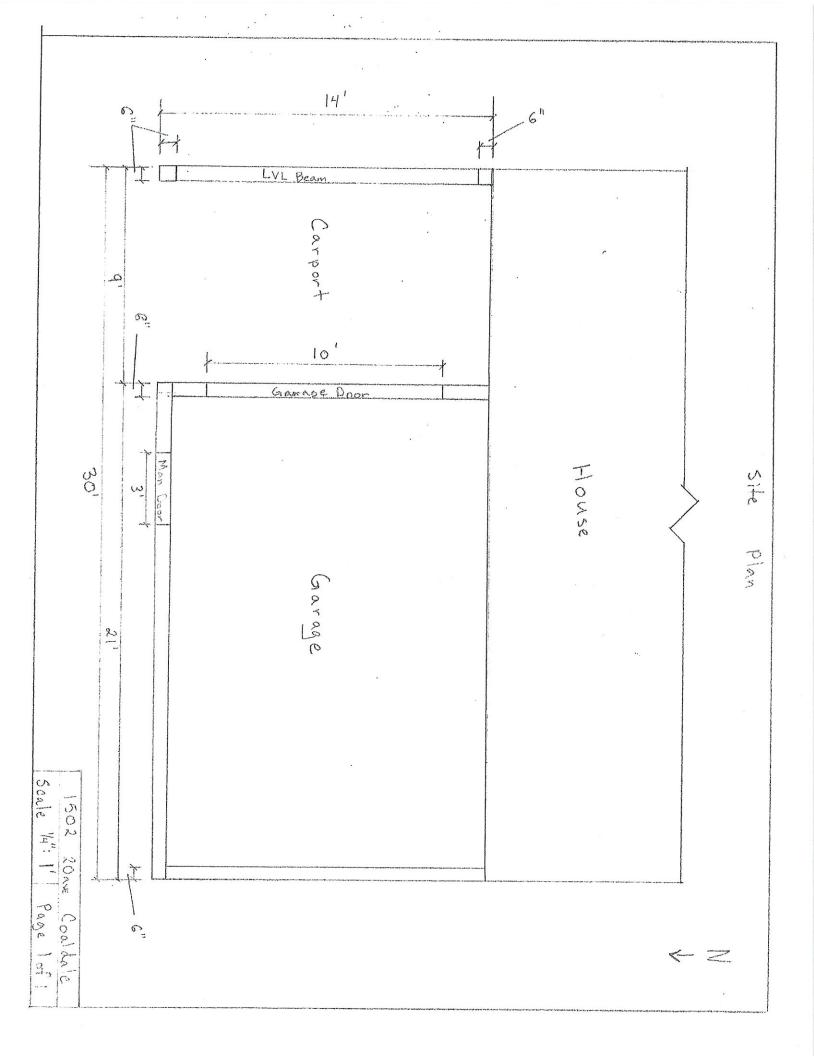
