 Beauchamp responded that yes, there is demand for the bus passes as they sell out quickly however I am not sure what the availability for Palliser to increase capacity is at this time.
- ➤ Councillor Hohm inquired if Palliser has any statistics of how many actually ride the bus vs how many buy passes are spoken for? I hear in the community that kids only use the passes 6 times a year leaving the bus capacity at 60-70 percent the rest of the time.
- Councillor Simpson echoed Councillor Hohm's concern but also hears the busses are very full.
- Councillor Simpson further inquired if there is a way for Palliser to re-word their letter for those unsure of the 2.4km minimum. As a Councillor, I received a lot of calls on this matter. K. Beauchamp will inquire.
- Councillor Chapman inquired if it can be reviewed for capacity issues and what number of pass applications are out there? K. Beauchamp will follow up.

They are asking about a letter that was sent out to the Town of Coaldale, requesting municipal assessment information and that it be sent to Derrick Krizsan, CAO with the MD of Taber, with a March 20th deadline.
